Dundee renewable energy plant

Members of the public are being invited to attend a public exhibition in Dundee between 28 - 30 January to view new plans for a renewable energy plant at the Port of Dundee.

FORTH ENERGY, a partnership between Scottish & Southern Energy and Forth Ports, has organised a series of public exhibitions which will enable the local community to find out more about plans for a state-of-the-art biomass renewable energy plant at King George V Dock.

Forth Ports chief executive Charles Hammond said: "Scotland has the potential to be a real powerhouse in renewable energy and this modern plant will make a major contribution to meeting Scotland's energy needs in the decades ahead.

"Deep-water ports are the ideal locations for such developments, enabling sustainably-sourced softwood fuel to be transported directly to the plants by ship.

"This represents a fundamental improvement to the way we generate electricity and will place Dundee at the forefront of helping to achieve the ambitious carbon reduction targets set out in the recent Climate Change (Scotland) Act."

The proposed plant would have the capacity to generate clean, renewable electrical energy sufficient to power 160,000 homes and could also be capable of producing renewable heat.
