

Forth Energy Leith renewable energy plant

Members of the public are being invited to attend a public exhibition in Leith between 11 – 13 February to view new plans for a renewable energy plant at the Port of Leith.

FORTH ENERGY has organised a series of public exhibitions for the local community to find out more about plans for a state-of-the-art biomass renewable energy plant at the Port of Leith.

Forth Ports chief executive Charles Hammond said: "Scotland has the potential to be a real powerhouse in renewable energy. Deep-water ports are the ideal for such developments, enabling sustainably-sourced softwood fuel to be transported directly to the plants by ship.

"This improvement to the way we generate electricity will place Leith at the forefront of helping Scotland achieve carbon reduction targets."

The proposed plant would have the capacity to generate clean, renewable electrical energy sufficient to power up to 160,000 homes and could also be capable of producing renewable heat.
